# Fivehead Village Plan The Questionnaire

After a deal of head-scratching and lively debate the Questionnaire sub-group [Andrew Barrett, Barry Knox and Mervyn Wilson] put its suggested list of questions to the Steering Group this month. The questions cover a mixture of general information, items from the survey we did in the autumn and ideas from the Committee and other plans we have looked at.

As you will see in due course, the range and variety of topics and issues is wide, but due to a disciplined approach we have contained the size of the survey to around 60 main questions: don't be alarmed, they are mostly easy to answer! [as in 'how old are you?']. Hopefully the format we have settled on will keep you all awake.

In the process of developing the questions we have trimmed their number, particularly those needing lengthy written explanations, but at the end there is a spot where your family can raise any issues that have not been included elsewhere.

Members of the committee will deliver it to every household following the Open Day; they will collect it, and then there is the task of analysis. When that is done we expect to have a further public meeting in the early autumn to make known the response. There will be then an opportunity for general comment and feedback and identification and refinement of action points.

Following that we shall work on the definitive report.
