WATER MAIN REPLACEMENT – FIVEHEAD, SOMERSET

How will the work affect you?

Temporary road closures will be in place at Stillbrook Road, from 30 May to 4 June; Islemoor Road, from 12 June to 18 June; Stowey Road, from 19 June to 25 June; and in Top Road, from 21 June to 13 July.

There will also be temporary traffic lights in place on the A378 for three weeks from 21 June.

Warning signs will be erected prior to all the road closures and diversion routes, will be in place during these closures.

Three bridleways on the eastern side of Fivehead will be temporarily closed until 13 October, with diversion routes signposted, although Swell Drove bridleway will be open on Sundays if work is not being carried out in the area.

The work is scheduled to be completed by October 2006.

Tuesday April 4th Club Members were treated to a most interesting and hilarious talk by Mr Stephen Sylvester of his experiences during the War as a Bevan Boy. Because of the shortage of labour in the Coal Mines due to Miners being conscripted into the Armed Forces. The Coal Industry found itself short of Men to keep the coal flowing for the War Effort, and through the Minister of Labour at that time, the well known Minister Aneurin Bevan drafted into the Mines young 18 year old Boys as substitute to keep the Mines going. The method of selection was cruel by being done at random by the last few digits of their Conscription serial number when being called up to serve in the Forces.

Mr Sylvester was one of those unlucky to be chosen, having previously been an Amateur Actor in Repertory, which brought about the funny stories of his time down the Coal Pits having to mix with others and especially the older Welsh Miners. The audiences were rolling down the aisles with laughter at his adventures as he had a contagious sense of humour telling his tales. A most entertaining and enjoyable talk, hopefully he may return again to visit us.

Tuesday 2nd May This was a half-day outing to Salisbury. Members and Friends left Fivehead at 10.00am on a damp and overcast morning for the Coach trip to Salisbury arriving at 12 noon by which time the weather had improved. Everybody enjoyed exploring Salisbury, visiting the Cathedral, Museum, also seeing the late Edward Heath's House, and of course a little shopping. Congregating back at the Coach for a pleasant late afternoon drive across Salisbury Plain arriving home at 5.45pm

You may have noticed this month's magazine is called Fivehead Village Magazine. This fits in well with the website address of **www.fivehead-village.org.uk** and also saves confusion now the church newsheet is now delivered with the newsletter.

There has been much justified concern about the speed traffic travels at along the A378 and this was crystallized after the fatal accident on the bend by Mullion Cottage and Webbers. Council has responded to these by writing to the Corporate Director of Environment at Somerset County Council and the Police. Copies of all the correspondence received from the residents of the top road have been enclosed with these letters and we await the responses. As safety measures were being taken during the period when the road was being resurfaced an approach was made for some sort of warnings to be put before the blind bend but the response from the Casualty Reduction Team seemed far from promising.

The laying of the new water pipe will be causing disruption both by road closures and increased heavy traffic. Wessex water has promised an update for this magazine so all detail is left for them to relay. Advance notices of closures are posted on the PC notice board. Wessex Water have promised that there will be access along the bridleway from Islemoor Road to Moortown Lane on Sundays only.

There has been a recent spate of fly tipping. If you see any please let the clerk know and she will arrange (hopefully!) for its removal.

As Inspector Pitman was unable to attend on June 5th he is now scheduled to come to the PC meeting on Sept. 4th.
